As the Owen L. Coon Professor of Psychiatry, Dr. Linda A. Teplin has continued to excel in her efforts to conduct well-funded research, educate the next generation of Northwestern psychiatrists, and serve as an expert on our nation's health and criminal justice systems. She continues to play a pivotal role leading the Northwestern Juvenile Project, the first large scale, longitudinal study of psychiatric disorders and outcomes of delinquent youth. This project, conducted through the Health Disparities and Public Policy program in the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences, assesses a broad range of outcomes, including psychiatric disorders, trajectories of substance abuse, patterns of service utilization, violence, HIV/AIDS, and death rates.

In addition, Dr. Teplin continues to contribute regular service to the medical school, Northwestern University, and the national scientific community. Most notably, her work has informed and advanced national public policy. Recently, she has served on two Department of Justice boards:

as a member on the Task Force on Suicide Prevention for Youth in Contact with the Juvenile Justice System, and as a member of the Science Advisory Board Subcommittee in the Department of Justice's Office of Justice Programs (OJJDP).

At the Feinberg School, she serves as chair of the Medical School Appointments, Promotion and Tenure Committee, a member of the Liaison Committee on Medical Education, chair of the Advisory Board for the Biostatics Collaboration Center, and vice chair of research and chair of the Small Grants Committee for the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences.
